





Please stand as the priest enters. All make the sign of the cross and bow at "Glory to the Father...Holy Spirit" (throughout).












We humbly pray to Jesus Christ, who rescues us from the darkness |of sin, * and in faith |we cry out:






All make the sign of the cross. The Priest or Cantor may sing the first line, then all sing the entire Magnificat. The psalmtone intonation is used throughout.






